Since 1993, Civic Works has positively impacted Baltimore's communities, through a combination of job training, skills development and community service.

Baltimore Center for Green Careers (BCGC)

Our programs provide training in brownfields remediation and home energy efficiency. Participants earn industry-recognized certifications and receive job placement assistance. The EnergyReady and Retrofit Baltimore programs are housed at BCGC.

Baltimore County AVID

AmeriCorps members provide in-classroom tutoring; promote advanced placement classes and college awareness; help students develop time management and note-taking skills; and develop strategies to improve math, language arts and critical thinking.

Baltimore Energy Challenge

AmeriCorps members teach low to no cost ways to save energy to Baltimore City residents, businesses, and nonprofits through a grassroots effort in neighborhoods and schools.

Baltimore Orchard Project

BOP grows, gleans, and gives away fresh, local fruit in Baltimore. We partner with communities and families to identify and care for the many fruit trees that grow in yards, streets, and public places.

Clifton Mansion

Civic Works is headquartered in the historic Clifton Mansion, former home of War of 1812 Captain Henry Thompson and famed philanthropist Johns Hopkins. Clifton's legacy of service to Baltimore's communities is kept alive through our programs and activities.

Community Lot Team

AmeriCorps members transform vacant Baltimore City lots, often sites of demolished houses that are filled with trash and debris, into thriving community gardens and shared spaces.

Little Gunpowder Farm

Little Gunpowder Farm grows food in Baltimore County using sustainable methods. We provide Baltimore area residents with high-quality vegetables at an affordable price, while prioritizing skills training for young farmers and environmental stewardship of the land.

Project Lightbulb

AmeriCorps members provide Baltimore County residents with free supplies and information that they will need to increase home energy efficiency.

REACH! Partnership School

REACH! is an innovative, college-focused transformation school for Baltimore City middle and high school students operated by Civic Works. AmeriCorps members provide students with opportunities to learn marketable skills in construction and health care professions.

Real Food Farm

Real Food Farm is Civic Works' innovative urban agricultural enterprise engaged in growing fresh produce on six acres of land in Clifton Park in northeast Baltimore.
