Background SOURCE

- Baltimore Focus
- Network of over 100 SOURCE Partnering Community-Based Organizations (CBOs)
- Year 8 of Baltimore Action Projects
- Dedicated Graduate Student Intern with a Stipend + \$500 for Project Support to CBO
- Open to JHU BSPH and SON Students Only, with ability to work in-person in Baltimore



Background

Selected BAP Students

- Flexible Structure for Completing Projects
- Required Minimum of 100 Hours of Effort during the Academic Year
- Regularly Work with CBO Preceptor
- Receive a \$1,750 Stipend for their Work



What are Baltimore Action Projects?

- Real world public health practice opportunities
 - Pairs a JHU public health or nursing student with a SOURCE community partner
 - Focus on a Bloomberg American Health Initiative focus area
- A **partnership** between The Initiative, SOURCE and CBOs in Baltimore City
- In 2024-2025, a mix of in-person and hybrid opportunities are available.
 - Students should be available to collaborate with CBOs during Baltimore business hours.



BAP Student Commitments

- Service Hour Requirement: Complete and report a minimum of 100 hours
- On-going Work with CBO: Regularly meet with and communicate with their CBO preceptor(s)
- Communicate with JHU SOURCE and the Initiative: Timely and frequent communication
- Online Modules: Successful completion of assigned Online Modules to prepare for community activities.
- Employment Paperwork: Complete required paperwork in a timely manner
- Student Reflections: Complete 3 synchronous cohort reflection activities
- *Final Submissions:* Students are required to complete a final report, submit final deliverable(s), and participate in a Program Impact activity (to be determined by the cohort)

BAP Application Process

- Prioritize projects by your interests. You may apply to a <u>maximum of 2</u> BAP projects
- Submit online application, <u>DEADLINE</u>: <u>Wednesday</u>, <u>July 31 by 11:59 pm ET</u>
- Interviews <u>Between August 19 September 4th</u>
- Notify Accept/Not Accept <u>September 4th</u>
- Placement notification <u>September 5th</u>



Tips for Applying to BAP

- Don't limit yourself to one opportunity
- Carefully review the requirements and skills needed for each opportunity
- Craft personal statements specific to each opportunity
- Consider your interest in the project(s)
- Review the type of involvement (in-person, hybrid) and location of the organization

BAP FAQs

- Do I need to be in/near Baltimore? **Yes**
- Can more than 1 student work on a single BAP? **No**
- Can a BAP count towards my MPH practicum? Yes
- Can I call the organization to ask about the project? **No**
- Are these research projects? No
- How will I receive my payments? Required HR paperwork, reporting hours, 2
 payments
- Can I interview via video? Yes, though we encourage in-person interviews
