- ❖ Referrals to other service providers, including low-cost legal help
- ❖ Cross-cultural workshops to help newcomers to function effectively in their new surroundings, with programs on health issues, the American legal system, financial literacy, entrepreneurship, computer and internet skills, and other topics of interest
- ❖ ERICA Boutique provides gently-used clothing and household items
